Cream Candy.

Dear Editor: I will send Miss Emma a recipe for cream candy:

Put 4 cupfuls of white sugar and 1 cupful of water into a bright pan on the range and let it boil without stirring for 10 minutes. If it looks somewhat thick, test it by letting some drop from the spoon, and if it threads remove the pan to the table.

Take out a small spoonful and rub it against the side of a cake bowl; if it becomes creamy and will roll into a ball between the fingers, pour the whole into the bowl. When cool enough to bear your finger in it take it in your lap; stir or beat it with a large spoon.

It will soon begin to look like cream, and then grow stiffer, until you find it necessary to take your hands and work it like bread dough.

If it is not boiled enough to cream, set it back upon the range and let it remain one or two minutes more, taking care not to cook it too much. Add the flavoring as it begins to cool. A pretty form is made by coloring some pink. In working should the cream get cold warm it.

Recipes Requested.

Ginger snaps—One cup sugar, $\frac{1}{2}$ cup creamed together, 1 pint sorgum molasses with 1 teaspoon soda in it, 2 eggs; beat together till light; stir in flour to make it better stiff. The more you knead it the better Roll out thin and cut with cutter; bake (Yum, yum)

Lemon crackers—One and one-quarter cups sugar, 1 egg, $\frac{1}{2}$ cup lard, $\frac{1}{2}$ pint sweet milk, $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon oil, lemon, $\frac{1}{2}$ ounce cream ammonia; beat sugar and lard together, then add the egg well beaten; then add ammonia in the sweet milk; add the lemon; then stir in flour to make it stiff knead well; roll out as thin as pie crust cut in squares; stick with fork and bake.

Peanut candy for Ada Standfield— $\frac{1}{2}$ cups sugar and 1 cup water and $\frac{1}{2}$ cup vinegar and 1 teaspoonful of cream till it gets brittle when tried in water; ready 1 pint peanuts shelled; grease a shallow pan; pour the candy in this; spread the peanuts over the top; pour through the good old GLOBE-OCRAT.

Good Cake.

NEWBURGH, IND., September 15.—As I saw in your columns that Miss Pearl Stillbauer wanted a caramel and chocolate cake receipt, I thought I would send her my receipt, which is as follows:

CARAMEL CAKE.

One even cup of butter, 2 even cups of sugar, 1 even cup of sweet milk, 3 even cups of flour, whites of 8 eggs (well beaten), 2 teaspoonsfuls of baking powder, 2 teaspoonsfuls of vanilla. Stir sugar and butter to a cream; add milk slowly; then the flour, in which the baking powder has been well sifted, and lastly the well-beaten whites of 8 eggs and 2 teaspoonsfuls of vanilla.

FILLING FOR CARAMEL CAKE.

Two cups of brown sugar, 1 cup of sweet cream, 2 teaspoonsfuls of vanilla, butter the size of an egg, and just a small pinch of soda to prevent milk from curdling; boil until thick; when cool, spread over top and sides.

Chocolate Cake.

To THE EDITOR OF THE GLOBE-DEMOCRAT:

CEDAR FORK, MO., September 17.—I will send the desired receipt for chocolate cake: Two cups sugar, one cup butter, yolks of five eggs, whites of two and one cup of sweet milk. Thoroughly mix two teaspoonsful of good baking powder by sifting several times; with three and one-half cups flour while dry; cream the sugar and butter together and then mix all together as you would any other cake. Bake in jelly tins. Mix for filling: Whites of three eggs and one and one-half cups of sugar.

Chocolate—no (I mean the real chocolate) and one tablespoonful of vanilla, beat together in a small vessel on the stove till it is boiling. Then spread between the layers and on top of cake. Use white sugar. MRS. R. G. RIEFENSTAHL.

Magic Cake.

Kind Editor: I will tell the ladies how to make magic cake: $\frac{1}{2}$ cup of butter, 1 cup sugar, 3 eggs, 1 cup sifted flour, 3 tablespoonsfuls of cream, 1 cup of tartar and $\frac{1}{2}$ cup of vanilla. Flavor with Bos.

ANGEL FOOD.

Eleven eggs, beaten to snow; $\frac{1}{2}$ cups of sugar sifted five times, 1 cup of flour sifted five times, $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoonfuls of cream of tartar put in the flour. After eggs are beaten put in the sugar, stirring slowly; then the flour the same way. Flavor to suit taste. Bake fifty minutes in a moderate slow oven. Do not grease pan. Do not cut it for twenty-four hours.

DEVIL'S CAKE.

Grate $\frac{1}{2}$ cup of chocolate, pour over $\frac{1}{2}$ cup of boiling water, add 1 teaspoonful of soda; let stand while making cake. Two cups of sugar, one-half cup of butter, 1 cup of sour milk, 2 eggs, 1 cup of vanilla; add chocolate powder into 1 cup corn starch, mixed with 3 cups of sifted flour, and heat in slow oven; flavor to taste; beat all thoroughly; then put in buttered tins, lined with paper; bake slowly in a moderate oven; ice the top. This makes a beautiful cake for.

I will send recipe for bride's cake: Cream together 1 cup of butter and 3 cups of sugar, add 1 cup of milk; then whites of 12 eggs, beaten light; sift 3 teaspoonsfuls of baking powder into 1 cup corn starch, mixed with 3 cups of sifted flour, and heat in slow oven; flavor to taste; beat all thoroughly; then put in buttered tins, lined with paper; bake slowly in a moderate oven; ice the top. This makes a beautiful cake.

Preserves and Cookies.

Preserve peaches—Peel fruit and place in a jar, put sugar over them and let stand over night. In the morning pour syrup into a vessel and heat till boiling, then put the fruit in and cook until nicely preserved. I find that this keeps the fruit from cooking to pieces.

GOOD COOKIES.

Two cups soft sugar, 1 cup lard, 8 tablespoons water, 1 tablespoon vinegar, a pinch of soda and 2 teaspoons baking powder, 3 eggs and flour to roll. Handle as little as possible; roll same as other cookies, sprinkle over top with granulated sugar and bake in a hot oven.

Break one egg into a cup and fill with sweet milk; mix with it half a cup of yeast, half cup butter, one cup sugar, enough flour to make a soft dough; flavor with nutmeg. Let rise till very light; let rise second time in pan; bake, and when nearly done glaze with a little molasses and cream. Use the same cup, no matter about the size, for each measure. Now, this is good, for we have tried it.

CHOCOLATE FILLING.

Put a cupful of sweet milk on the stove and let boil, and then put in one cup of sugar, one and one-half cups of butter and add one-half cup of sweet chocolate. Let it boil till it thickens. This is fit for a king.

Gentlemen, here is a recipe up to date: One cup of sugar, one-half cup of butter beaten together; one egg, one-fourth cup of milk, one pint of flour, one teaspoonful of cream of tartar, one-half teaspoonful of soda, one and one-fourth teaspoonful of vanilla; cut in little strips, roll in sugar and bake in a quick oven. Use your hands to roll them instead of a rolling-pin. This is an up-to-date recipe for all of you; but I am afraid I am about to write too much; though I want to ask one more thing: Can you or some of your many readers tell me how you take ink out of cotton goods? Papa says the man who has been bothered with night sweats to set a pan of water under his bed and he won't be bothered with them any more.

Rolled Jelly Cake.

Please publish this for a little girl asking a recipe for rolled jelly cake: Three eggs, the yolks beaten with 1 cup of sugar; 2 tablespoonsfuls of sweet milk; beat the whites to a froth, then thoroughly with the yolks and sugar; mix 1 heaping teaspoonsful of baking powder with 1 cup of flour; add to the other ingredients; flavor with lemon and bake immediately in a moderate hot oven in a wide bread pan. While hot, remove from the pan and lay on a cloth wet with cold water; spread with jelly and roll quickly. Sprinkle with powdered sugar.

COFFEE CAKE.

I will also send a recipe for splendid coffee cake, which I know to be very good, because it is papa's favorite cake. So here it is: One egg, 1 cup of brown sugar, 1 cup of molasses, 1 cup of butter, 1 cup of strong coffee—cold, 1 pound of raisins, 1 cup of cinnamon, 1 nutmeg, grated; 1 heaping tablespoonful of soda, 4 or 5 cups of flour. Mix it very stiff and bake in a moderate oven for an hour. Older in place of coffee is a very nice substitute.

Lemon Pie.

Two pie tins with crust; perforate at times with a fork to keep crust from rising in center and bake; make a filling of juice and grated rind of 1 lemon, 1 cup of sugar, 3 eggs; save whites of two for meringue and three tablespoons of flour; stir all altogether and have ready 1 pint of boiling water in a granite basin; stir in mixture; let come to a boil and remove from the stove; fill the crusts. Make meringue with whites of eggs beaten to a stiff froth and a little granulated sugar; spread on pie; slightly brown in oven.

PEANUT COOKIES.

A good recipe for peanut cookies follows: One pint of peanuts, chopped fine; 2 tablespoons of butter, 1 cup of sugar, 3 eggs, 2 tablespoons of milk, a pinch of salt. Cream the butter and sugar together, add the beaten eggs, nuts and other ingredients and enough flour to make a soft dough. Roll out in circles and bake in a moderate oven. Please try this and report.

CHEAP CHRISTMAS PLUM CAKE.

Dissolve a level teaspoon of soda in two tablespoons of warm water; add to it one-half pint of very thick sour cream; stir it for a moment; turn it into a bowl and add one-half cup of New Orleans molasses; mix thoroughly; add one-half pint of brown sugar, one cup allspice, one tablespoon of cinnamon and three and one-half cups of sifted pastry flour. The batter must be very thick. Then stir in one pound of raisins that have been stoned and cut into halves and floured. Turn this into a square pan, lined with greased paper, and bake in a very moderate oven for an hour and a half, or steam one hour and bake for the remaining half hour. Cake made after this recipe will keep for a long time. Indeed, it grows better with age. It may be iced and decorated as the more expensive cakes are.

SUBSTITUTE FOR PLUM PUDDING.
Roll and sift one pint of stale bread crumbs; add one cup of flour, one teaspoon of cinnamon, one-half grated nutmeg, one cup brown sugar, one pound of seedless raisins, one-fourth pound of shredded citron, floured, and one-half pound of raw suet, freed from membrane and chopped fine; mix thoroughly. Dissolve one teaspoon of baking soda in two tablespoons of water, and add it to one cup of New Orleans molasses; add one egg, well beaten, the juice and grated rind of one lemon, and pour it into the dry ingredients. Work all carefully together until it is moist, not wet, and pack it down into a greased kettle or mold. Cover and boil continuously for four hours. Lift the lid of the mold until the pudding is cold, then cover and stand aside. Repeat at serving time. This pudding may be made a week before Christmas and heated for the Christmas dinner. Serve hot with hard sauce, or next best thing is jelly sauce. Put half a tumblerful of currant jelly into a saucepan, and add one pint of water and the juice of one lemon. Moisten one tablespoon of corn starch, with a little cold water; add it to the jelly and water; cook and stir until thick and smooth. Serve hot.

DEVIL'S FOOD CAKE.

CAYUGA, IND., October 8.—Cold Tomato Catsup—Take one-half peck, or twelve large tomatoes, skinned and chopped fine; one teacupful of chopped onions, one teacupful of sugar, one-half teacupful of salt, three-fourths teacupful of mustard seed, one tablespoonful of black pepper, one teaspoonful of ground cloves, one teaspoonful of ground allspice, one teaspoonful of ground cinnamon, one teaspoonful of ground mace, two red peppers chopped fine (without seeds), 10c worth of celery seed, one teacupful of grated horseradish, pint of vinegar. Stir well and let it stand a week before using. Put in a stone jar, cover, put in a cool, dry place. It will be good a year.

GLEN ST. MARY, FLA., June 19.—I saw in the last paper, which came to-day, a recipe in rhyme for doughnuts, so thought I would send one in rhyme for a very nice cake with fruit in it. I like your paper very much, what time I have taken. I have always varied the cake recipe a little, as I consider it to be an improvement. The variation is this: do not put in quite a teaspoonful of soda, but just enough to counteract the acid in the fruit. I put in two teaspoonfuls of baking powder.

First take one cup of butter,

Add two cups of white sugar,

And then together beat

Three eggs all lightly foaming,

Of good sweet milk one cup,

One teaspoonful of soda,

To lightly raise it up;

Then add one cup of currants,

And just four cups of flour,

And put it in the oven,

When he shall taste the cake.

AN OLD BACHELOR.**Good Recipes.**

I will give a few recipes:
White cake—Two-thirds cup of butter, 2 cups sugar, 3 cups flour, cup sweet milk, whites of 5 eggs, 2 teaspoons baking powder; any flavoring desired.

Caramel filling for cake—One and one-third cups sugar, one-half cup thick sweet cream and a lump of butter; boil together until it is thick; spread between layers and on top.

Butter cake—Sift two and a half pounds of flour, in which mix three spoonfuls of baking powder. Cream three pounds of sugar and two cups of butter together. Beat eighteen and mix with the sugar and butter; add 1 cup of beaten almonds, a teaspoonful of lemon juice; sift in the flour, pour in 1 cup of milk, and with a set of rose nodes.

Three Good Recipes.

BEECHWOOD, WIS., September 26.—An find pleasure in reading the GLOBE-DEMOCRAT, and the nice recipes in it. I will be glad to give some of the readers my recipes.

MUSTARD PICKLES.

Two quarts small cucumbers, two quarts white onions, two cauliflower, four green peppers; soak in salt brine twenty-four hours, and scald in same brine until a little tender. Drain through two quarts vinegar, one cup brown sugar, two tablespoons of mustard, two of flour, one ounce turmeric; mix with cold vinegar and make a smooth paste by boiling. Put your pickles in and heat well. They keep in jars.

GINGER COOKIES.

One and one-quarter cups sugar, one cup syrup, one cup lard; boil until smooth. When cool, put in two eggs, teaspoon ginger, one teaspoon soda, one-quarter cup hot water, flour to roll.

FRUIT CAKE.

One and one-half cups sugar, one-half cup butter, one-half cup lard, three eggs, one teaspoon cloves, one nutmeg, three teaspoons cinnamon, one and one-half teaspoons soda, one cup currants, one cup raisins, one cup sour milk; flour to suit. Would some one please advise me what to do with poor hair on little girl, when it is so dry and seems to break or rub off? And, also, a cure for bed-wetting by a 7-year-old child?
