PREFACE

I was born near the home of my great grandfather, James Wright, who was an early settler of this country (Monroe Co., Ind.) and absorbed many family traditions at an early age. Well do I remember great grandfather Wright's funeral, although I was quite a small child at the time. Perhaps the incident of my sister's nearly falling into the grave impressed it upon my memory more than the ceremony itself.

I became seriously interested in learning more about my ancestors when we returned to our home in Bloomington in 1906 after an absence of eight years. While Mr. White was pursuing his studies at Indiana University for his M.A. degree, I did some research in genealogy. In 1907 my husband accepted a position at Vanderbilt University in Nashville, Tennessee, and while there I continued my search by writing dozens of letters, especially about my Revolutionary ancestors and their descendants. By the time I moved back to Bloomington, in 1930, I had collected much data and decided to put it into a genealogy of the Wright family.

Since then I have written hundreds of letters, examined many court house records, visited many relatives in different cities and states, gathered many old cemetery records and paid for many other records furnished by county officials and genealogists at distant points. I have worked many nights until midnight and while the task has been laborious, I have enjoyed putting the story of the Wright family together, bit by bit, much like a patchwork quilt.

No monetary reward is expected from this venture; the only returns hoped for are the thrills derived in compiling the data and the knowledge that this is perhaps one of the greatest contributions an individual can make to his people of the present and future generations.

Mr. Grant Wright of Salem, Indiana, had done a great deal of research on the Wright family some years ago, and was kind enough to give me some data. It has been invaluable, especially the older data. Also Prof. Wayne Smith, Mosco, Idaho has given data.

It is impossible to thank all by name here who have contributed to this history. I have tried to mention the source of records in many places throughout the book.

The name *Wright* seems to be of Anglo-Saxon derivation and means a workman, especially an artificer in wood or hard materials. Wright, at the present time, means carpenter in Scotland.

We have consulted many books giving the early history of the Wrights and believe that most of the English and Irish Wrights are descendants of Wryghta (Wryta) family of Bayeux, Normandy. The Old English Biographical Dictionary states that the Wryghts came from Normandy with William the Conqueror in 1066. Hereditary surnames were just coming into use in Normandy at that time and the Normans brought the fashion into England. (Vol. VIII, page 3000, Enc. Britannica, Vol. XVII, page 169, ninth edition.)

Some families by the name of Wright came to America as early as 1636. Many Wrights took an active part in the Revolutionary war and some were officers. The family also had its authors, poets, educators, reformers, missionaries, financiers, and men of science as well as professional men. We are justly proud of the early min-

isters, venerable pioneers who do belong to our family, and who by their labor, sacrifices, and their exemplary lives helped establish the principles of Christian Citizenship in the counties where they settled.

I have made an earnest effort to contact all descendants of Richard Wright Sr., but I know that many have been omitted because I do not know about them. I have tried to be accurate and present a true picture of the Wrights but assume no responsibilities for errors should they occur. In order to save space we have abbreviated many common terms used in genealogies such as: born, died, died young, deceased, married, unmarried, about, infancy, daughter, unknown, and perhaps others.

In the numbering system used in this book, the first or index number denotes the generation of that person from Richard Wright, Sr., while the second number indicates the numerical order of that child in its family. For example the number of William Wright (son of Richard Wright Sr)., is 2-5 which means he is of the second generation and the fifth child in the family.

As this book goes to press, we are in the midst of the terrible World War II to preserve Christianity and civilization. We are giving our sons, daughters and husbands to help save our country from the enemy and protect our freedom. I still believe in the God of our fathers and know that He will deliver us if we will but trust in Him who moves in mysterious ways His wonders to perform.

Richard Wright, Sr.

1. By Grant Wright: "Tradition has it that Richard Wright, Sr. was born in England, emigrated to Wales, came back into England, and he, with four brothers, emigrated to America probably sometime about 1746. They came to the Eastern coast of Maryland. Here they separated. Two went into New England, one went into New York, and Richard with one brother came into Virginia, then to Randolph Co., N.C. Later Richard moved to Rowan Co., N.C., where he spent the remainder of his life."

According to D.A.R. records, Richard Wright, Sr., was born 1730 and died in 1785. We know his will was probated Feb. 8, 1785. Mr. Grant Wright says, "He is supposed to have been buried in a cemetery on the Waters of the Uharie in Davidson Co. near the Randolph Co. line. There has not been a burial in that cemetery for more than 100 years. The graves are marked with crude stones bearing no inscriptions." (Addie Wright Helper says this cemetery is about two miles from Silver Valley Cross Roads, N.C. *Pioneer Preachers of Indiana* by Madison Evans, published by J. Challen and Sons of Philadelphia in 1862 says the Wrights came from England. D.A.R. records say Richard Wright, Sr. married in Rowan County, N.C. in 1748. Judge Lee Wright of Salisbury, N.C. says in his manuscript, "The first deed found so far in Rowan Co. to Richard Wright was dated 1762, in Book 5 page 366") D.A.R. records also say his wife's name was Jane. The History of Bartholomew and Jackson County, published in 1904 by B. F. Bowen, on page 745, calls her name Nancy. Perhaps the real name was Nancy Jane as Nancy is often shortened to Ann or Nan. In 1939, Mrs. Kyle Wright Hill descendant of Richard, Jr. learned thru Mrs. Willborn of High Point, N.C. that when Richard's will was probated, the widow was Ann. D.A.R. record gives the date of her death as 1795. Grant Wright's manuscript says "It seems that Richard Wright, Sr. was a large land-owner and accumulated well for one in his day. Richard Sr. was a revolutionary soldier, a private in the N.C. Militia from Rowan Co. It is said that his five oldest sons also fought in the Revolution."

We know that Richard Wright, Sr., and his sons Benjamin, Richard, Jr. and William, have been used many times for D.A.R. membership. We have no information about Peter or John.

Grant Wright says he had the names and dates of Richard Wright, Sr.'s children from Elder Ezekiel Wright of Putnam Co., Indiana, who sent them to his father many years ago. Miss Mary Lee Woodrum, of Putnam Co., Ind., says her father also had the same names and dates. They are as follows:

Will of Richard Wright, Sr.

From the office of Clerk Superior Court, Rowan County, Salisbury, North Carolina, in Will Book C, page 207:

“In the name of God Amen, I Richard Wright Senr. of the County of Rowan & State of North Carolina being through the abundant mercy and goodness of God tho weak in body Yet of a sound and perfect understanding & Memory do constitute this my last Will and Testament, and desire it may be Received by all as such. As for my burial I desire it to be decent without pomp or State at the discretion of my dear Wife and as to my worldly Estate I will and positively order that all my debts be paid. I give and bequeath to my son Benjamin, Two hundred Acres of land lying on the Waters of deep River in Randolph County, Including the plantation whereon he used to live, etc. I give to my Son Peter Twenty Shillings etc—I give to my Sons Richard & William an Entry of land containing 226 Acres lying in Randolph County on the Waters of Nary to be divided equally at their own discretion. I give to my son Amus, One hundred Acres of land including the house wherein he now lives & the price of a new Saddle and Bridle, & I likewise give to my son William a feather Bed and furniture and the price of a good Saddle and Bridle etc—I give to my Son John a cow and Calf or the Value thereof in Gold and Silver etc—I give to my Son Philburd a Horse Bridle and Saddle and a Cow and feather Bed and furniture at the age of Twenty One—or at his Mothers discretion and this plantation where I now live at his Mothers decease or Marriage and I give to my dear and loving Wife Two hundred Acres of land lying on deep River where I formerly used to live in Randolph County to sell at her discretion and likewise all my moveable property that I possess and if she marries, two thirds of the Estate is to be divided equal amongst the Children and if she dies without marrying, the principle Estate is to be divided equal amongst the all my children. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this third day of Septr: Anno Dom: 1784

James Morgan Junr.

The will was probated Feb. 8, 1785 by Evans Wright and James Morgan Junr. His widow, Ann, and William Wright qualified giving bond of 200 pounds with James Morgan as security.

The Clerk who sent will says the “Waters of Nary” could be “Uary”, If so, it probably meant the River Uharie.

Benjamin Wright, Sr.

2-1 Benjamin Wright, Sr., son of Richard Wright, Sr. and wife, (Ann,) or Nancy Jane was born 1752, died at his son Adam's near Indianapolis, Indiana about 1842, according to Grant Wright's records. We do not know where Benjamin was born. The first deed to his father in Rowan Co., N.C. was dated 1762.

Benjamin is named first in his father's will, dated Sept. 3, 1784, and given two hundred acres of land on the Waters of Deep River in Randolph Co., N.C. including the plantation whereon he used to live. Ben lived in this section of N.C. many years and relatives, still there, say Ben Wright Mountain in Randolph Co., was named for him. He moved to Indiana in 1820's with his second wife and their children. Many of his first children had already settled in Indiana. We find him listed in the Indiana census of 1830, in Wayne Twp., Marion Co., next to his youngest daughter, Celia Wright and husband, Nathaniel Bell. He was then between 80-90, and wife between 60-70. Nearby were his sons, Jordan and Judge Adam Wright. The 1840 census of Marion Co., Ind. gives all these children, but Benjamin Wright. With Jordan's family, however, is listed a female between 70-80. This was probably Jordan's mother.

Deed records show that Adam Wright's farm was just south of Trader's Point, Marion Co., Ind., on the Lafayette Road, now called the Bush farm. Osee Knouf could find no cemetery on this farm. Recently found that Adam and wife were buried in Old Union Cemetery, now between the Speedway and Clermont, Ind. Adam died not long after his father and probably they were buried in the same place. There is an old slab next to Adam's grave, so worn that a tracing shows only, A.B. Wright died 1837. The Indiana State Library has records of this cemetery which was copied a few years ago they say: A. B. Wright died Oct. 4, 1857. 3 and 5 would look something alike on an old slab. He lived to be about 86 years old.

U. S. Wright of Maryville, Mo., grandson of Ben, Jr., collected much data on Benjamin, Sr. from his elderly Aunts, daughters of Ben, Jr. They said Benjamin, Sr.'s first wife was Barbara, and his second Patsey. They remembered their Aunts, Sarah Hill, Martha Moss and Elizabeth Copple lived near enough to often walk over to visit, in Putnam Co., Ind. They gave the list of Benjamin Wright, Sr.'s children which follows. He married the second time 1795. Levi Woodrum said years ago three of Richard Wright, Sr.'s children married Morgan girls, Benjamin, Richard, and William.

Benjamin Wright, Sr., is said to have fought in the battle of Guilford County Court House in the Rev. War. He was paid for services according to N.C. Rev. Army Accounts, Vol. XI, page 73, folio 1; and Vol. XII, page 21, folio 2. One dated, Aug. 1783, other not dated. Copies of these records are filed at Memorial Continental Hall in Washington, D.C. under Nat. D.A.R. No. 291647. The publisher of this, said descendant of Benjamin Sr.'s son, James has proved that James's mother was a Morgan. Her younger brother, Eligah Morgan, settled near his nephew, James Wright in Monroe Co., Ind. 1817. Barbara Morgan Wright and Eligah Morgan's parents were James and Mary Morgan.

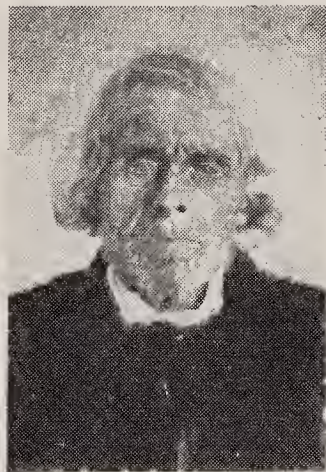

James Wright

3-4 James Wright, son of Benjamin and Barbara (Morgan) Wright, was born in Randolph Co., N.C., Dec. 16, 1781, and died May 11, 1873, at his home near Harrodsburg, Monroe Co., Ind. He was raised on his father's farm but went to Kentucky when a young man, and worked on a farm for Christian Sears, in Oldham Co., Ky. James married Elizabeth Sears, dau. of Christian and Catherine Sears, in about 1800. They lived a few years with Christian Sears in Ky., then moved to Utica, Ind. Their third child, David, was born Nov. 16, 1806, at Utica, Ind. Later they moved to Pigeon Roost, Ind. On Sept. 3, 1812, the historical Indian Massacre of Pigeon Roost was made. James and Elizabeth had five children at that time, Frankie Ann, Charity, David, Nancy, and Emsley. They lived east of the

Indian trail from the settlement and were spared. James was out working the next day when a man came running to tell him the sad news, that Pigeon Roost had been taken the night before by Shawnee Indians. Sixteen children and six women had been slaughtered. James took Nancy, the fourth child, on horse back to Ky., near Louisville, to his wife's parents, Christian and Catherine Sears. James and negro slaves took wagons back to get the rest of the family and the household goods. After peace had been declared, James moved his family to Washington, Co., Ind., then to Monroe Co. in 1816, when Ind. became a state.

James Wright entered land in Monroe Co., Ind. on Sept. 24, 1816, the S.E. Sec. 10, 160 acres. Later he entered eight other tracts of land making 1163 acres. One entry in Monroe Co. on Sept. 15, 1825, was for 80 acres in Twp. 7, N. of Range 2 W, SE sec. Lillie Wright Lane White, his great granddaughter, and writer of this book, has the sheepskin deed for this entry of land, and it is signed by President John Quincy Adams. James and his brother Jesse Wright, bought land from Thomas Hill and his wife Milley in 1824. James was at one time, one of the three largest tax payers in Monroe Co. His farm was eight miles south of Bloomington, Ind.

James Wright and family attended a log church on John Kutch's farm near the banks of Clear Creek. It was called Lather Wood Church. Later he helped build South Union Church. Many of his descendants were members of this church and are buried in the cemetery there. James was a faithful member of the church, read his Bible and had family prayers. In 1941, I saw his large Bible and most every page was marked, some written on where he was searching for knowledge of the Bible. He played the violin and sang hymns. He enjoyed life and died at the age of 92. He was able to work until he fell and broke his hip, when coming from the barn after feeding the cattle one cold winter morning. He lived for about three months. He was buried on his farm, a short distance from his brick home, by his

first wife Elizabeth. Many of his relatives are buried in this family cemetery. The writer of this sketch was at his funeral there on May 11, 1873.

Bloomington, Ind. was laid off on Apr. 10, 1818, and on the third day of the first Session, a log courthouse was ordered built, and the first Jurors of Monroe Co. were selected. James Wright and John Kuteh were among the selected Jurors. James Wright was Justice of the Peace from 1818 to 1827, inc.

James was tall, of medium size, and had blue eyes. He worked hard clearing off the timber and getting the fields ready to tend in grain.

Before I saw James' Bible, I was told that he was born at the beginning of the Revolution, and had a stone erected for him with the date of birth as 1775. His Bible gives 1781, which was at the close of the Revolution. James Wright's birth is given in the Ketchem and Kuteh Genealogy as 1775, which is a mistake.

He had to do as his master's slaves did. He ran off with James Wright to Ky., then to Indiana. He lived with James Wright until he married James' daughter. At one time he was one of the largest tax payers in Monroe Co. His farm was nine miles south of Bloomington, Ind. and joined that of his father-in-law's, James Wright. Isaac and Frankie Ann were buried in the Wright graveyard, on James Wright's farm one-half mile west of Vietor, Ind., Monroe, Co.

5-1 William Bowen, son of Isaac and Frankie Ann (Wright) Bowen, married Rebecea Hazel, b. Nov. 22, 1824, d. Mar. 1, 1895, dau. of Kalob Hazel, b. 1791, d. 1854, and wife, Mary (Etherton) Hazel, b. 1794, d. 1886. William and Rebecca Bowen owned a good farm three miles west of Harrodsburg, Ind. and lived there until their death. They were buried at Walker's Chapel. Rebecca's mother lived with them for years. William Bowen told a great many jokes and big yarns about hunting. He was known by everyone as Unele Bill.

Her father, James Wright, lived at Pigeon Roost at the time of the Shawnee Indian Massacre in 1812. He then moved his family back to Kentucky, then later back to Washington Co., Indiana, and even later to Monroe Co., Indiana.

Nancy Wright was united in marriage in 1824 on Sept. 29 to West Lee Wright, who was born in Wayne Co. Kentucky on Feb. 14, 1803. They were second cousins. James Wright, father of Nancy, was the son of Benjamin Wright and a grandson of Richard and Ann Wright.

West Lee Wright was the son of William and Martha (Patsy) (Morgan) Wright. He was born in Wayne Co. Kentucky on Feb. 14, 1803. While he was a boy, his parents removed to Washington Co., Indiana where the children were sent to school at Salem, Indiana. He was a grandson of Richard and Ann Wright, mentioned above. West Lee Wright and Nancy Wright moved to Jackson Co., Carr Township, in 1833 and located on rich bottom land in the White River Valley. At one time he owned three thousand acres of land in Jackson Co. On May 25, 1853, West Lee Wright laid off the town of Medora. The town received its name in honor of Alfred Wright, nephew of Nancy Wright, who taught singing in that town and was always singing the notes Me-do-ra. The Medora bank has the music scale of Me-do-ra on their checks. West Lee Wright liked music and could make a violin talk. He gave the ground for the church in Medora and his nephew, Clayburn Wright, son of Elijah Wright, West Lee's brother, was its first preacher. West Lee gave the lot for the school and the ground for the first railway. This right of way for the railroad was several miles long. He had his own sawmill installed in 1852 for the sawing of lumber used in building the town of Medora, Ind. The first doctor was Owen Wright of Mason, Ill., a nephew of West Lee Wright's, and son of Morgan Wright, brother of West Lee's. The first hotel was built by David Wright and his brother-in-law, Andrew McKinney, a son-in-law of West Lee Wright. West Lee Wright died on Sept. 16, 1876. His funeral was probably the largest ever held in Jackson Co. He belonged to the Masons, Independent Order of Odd Fellows, and the Independent Order of Good Templars. He and Nancy belonged to the Christian Church. Nancy Wright died Nov. 4, 1890. (West Lee named the streets of Medora for his children). Children:

She still reads some and retains an excellent memory. She likes to tell about her parents, especially her mother, she says: "My mother, who was the daughter of James and Elizabeth Wright, was born in Ky. Feb. 12, 1809, she and Abraham Lincoln were born on the same day. After she became old enough to remember events, her parents moved to this state and settled near the present site of Bloomington. They were there in the first settling of Monroe Co. When they went there it was in January but in those days they said 'Jinniwary'. At first they built what they called a 'lean-to'. It was sided up on three sides. They kept a log heap burning in front of it and lived in that during the day and slept in their covered wagon at night until they could hew logs and build themselves a house. They built an outdoor oven out of mud and stone. In that they did their baking. After they had formed a settlement they would bake enough on Saturday to last over Sunday and hold church around at the houses. Brother Sadler did the preaching.

When mother was twelve years old her mother let her spin enough yarn on the spinning wheel to make a coverlet. She then sent it to the loom and had it woven for her. I still have that coverlet and it is in very good condition after a hundred and twenty-one years. My father and mother were second cousins and both named Wright. They were married in 1824 in Monroe county. Father came to Jackson county and entered land in 1833. One night mother happened to be up waiting on one of the children and looked out and the whole elements seemed to be filled with balls of fire shooting in every direction. That was the great meteor shower of 1833. People used to say that was when the stars fell. I have an old Bible published in 1813, among the birth and death statistics recorded in that old book some one made mention of how in July, 1833 of that same year the cholera

was raging in this country at an alarming extent. When I was hardly three years old I went with mother over to a neighbor's house to stay all day. When we started home that evening the woman gave me an apple and told me to have my mother stick it full of cloves for me and I could keep it. I still have that apple and although that was right at ninety years ago we can still smell those cloves in it. There were fifteen children in our family but I am the only one now living and I am too badly crippled to go places anymore but hoping that those of you who are enabled to attend this reunion will have an enjoyable day."

June 5, 1783 in Randolph Co., N. C. They moved to Clark Co., Ind. in 1807; to Washington Co. for two years, then to Monroe Co., Then to Smith Twp., Green Co. in 1826. Among the first weddings in that township (Smith) was that of their daughter, Celia Wright to Samuel Wilks.

Wright Township was named for Richard Wright. Petition for Wright township was made in 1838. Other pioneers in Wright twp. besides Rev. Richard Wright included Peter Wright, William Wright, Isom Farris. The first school in the twp. was taught about 1823 or 1824, by one of the Wrights — some think, by a man named Poe. Richard Wright enlisted in the War of 1812 and served the entire time. He was slightly wounded while working at Fort Harrison. Richard Wright settled on a farm and built a blacksmith shop. This was a Lone Tree Prairie in Smith Twp. Wright sold this to Richard Lambert.

Old Uncle Richard Wright was Justice of Peace, he was also Justice of Peace in Monroe Co., Ind. He married in Monroe Co., West Lee Wright to Nancy Wright Sept. 29, 1824, Susan Wright to James Nickels Jan. 19, 1825, William S. Wright to Marguart Hite Feb. 28, 1825, P. Wright to Nancy Williams April 26, 1825, Nathonel Bell to Celia Wright April 26, 1825, Elias Arthur to Sarah Wright April 18, 1825, Abslom Morgan to Elizabeth May July 2, 1825, Soloman Morgan to Lydia Goodwin Oct. 1825, Eligah Wright to Elizabeth Conder April 16, 1826, David Wright to Caroline Kutch Feb. 1, (Sept. 14, 1827 D.A.R.), Elizabeth King to Thomas Bailey March 14, 1827, Jamima Morgan to Lewis Ritter May 28, 1827, and many others. Copied from Monroe Co., records. Richard was a good citizen. He died from a strange accidental gun shot while working in his blacksmith shop. Mr. Hornbaker of Bloomington, a great grandson of the above Rev. Richard Wright, told of Richard making his son Jerry a gun. It got choked with a lode fast, so he plugged up the gun and thought he would boil it to get the powder wet

so he could work with it. He put it to his ear to see if it was boiling, and it went off and killed him.

Mr. Hornbaker also said he had been told by his mother that Rev. Richard Wright often went to preach away from home. Before he left he assigned tasks to each child, and if they had not done the work when he returned, they were severely punished by the common method of that time, "whipping". Monroe Co. record, Richard entered land in Indian Creek Twp., Monroe Co., Ind. Sec. 23 W, 1/2 S.E. 80 A., on Nov. 7, 1818.

Mary was born on April 4, 1800 and died about September 30, 1847 in Putman County, Indiana. She was buried on the home farm in cemetery created in 1838 when her oldest son died.

Benjamin Wright served in the War of 1812. His record says: "Benjamin Wright enlisted from Randolph County, North Carolina on November 26, 1814 and served as a private in Capt. John Ransour's Company of North Carolina, militia until February 22, 1815. He was living in Putman County, Indiana in 1850 and in 1855 was residing in Cumberland County, Illinois age 61. He was allowed bounty land in full satisfaction for his services."

Benjamin and Mary (Hill) Wright moved with other relatives from North Carolina to Putman County, Indiana in 1822. Here they settled on a farm on Little Walnut Creek in Madison Township, west of Greencastle, Indiana, and about five miles north of Reelsville, Indiana.

This was their home until a few years after Mary's death, when he sold to his son William Wright and moved to Illinois, this is still in the possession of William Wright's grandson Raymond T. Wright.

3-8 Benjamin Jr. was Justice of Peace for many years in Putman County, Indiana. His grandson says he married many a couple in his cornfield, if they came while he was working. Marion Co., Ind. history says Jordan and Barbara Wright helped found the first Christian Church in Wayne Twp. He owned considerable land in Sec. 22 and Sec. 27 Twp. 16 Range 2 in Wayne Twp. Marion Co., Ind. He sold this in 1845. He and his family listed in the Marion Co., Ind. census for 1850 and for 1840. In 1840 an aged female was living with them, whom is believed was Jordan's mother.

The Mail was carried on horseback from Indianapolis to Lafayette. This post office was later discontinued. The oldest village in Pike Twp. is old Augusta. Page 499 Adam Wright was one of the associate Judges of the circuit court to which Marion Co., was attached, and held office from April 8, 1836 to April 6, 1850. Page 498 Adam Wright served as Judge of the Probate Court Sep. 23, 1850 to Oct. 13, 1850 (died). Adam had a large home and it was a tavern or half-way stop, especially for farmers driving cattle to Indianapolis. 2-5 William Wright, son of Richard and Ann or Nancy Jane Wright was born Mar. 25, 1761. (Authority) Pension claim s. 1601 16301 in Washington, D. C. He was born in North Carolina, Guilford Co. He was of English descent. William Wright and his wife lie buried in the Philburt Wright cemetery, located on State Highway 135 about 3 miles south of Salem, Ind. on the old Philburt Wright farm. I placed a marker at his wife's grave a few years ago. I had the name Elizabeth put on the marker. My father remembered William Wright. He wore a little red cap and I think he died at his son Arvin's on the farm where I own. And there is a D.A.R. marker at his grave. William m. Martha Morgan who was called Patsy, she was b. in N. C., Aug. 8, 1868, and d. in Ind. Sept. 17, 1834. Until recently we thought her name was Betsey, and it is put thus into records of D.A.R. and S.A.R. The Bible of her son West Lee Wright gave her name Martha. Mrs. Harvy Morris of Salem, Ind., searched records to determine her name, she found a deed from

William Wright and Marthew his wife to Wiley Johnson dated Nov. 18, 1832. Wright sold N $\frac{1}{2}$ S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 32. — 2. N. 4E. for #600. the name should have been spelled Martha. Martha was the daughter of James and Mary Morgan. Martha was sometimes called Patsey, she was buried by her husband. William Wright enlisted in Randolph Co. N. C., sometime in Dec. 1780 and served three months as private in Capt. James Robinsons Co. Col. John Litterals, N. C. Regiment. He served a few weeks later as substitute for Philbert Wright 3 months in Capt. John Ranes Co. and was in several skirmishes with the Tories. He moved to Rowan Co., N. C. and served 3 mo. in Capt. William Grey's Co. Col. Thomas Dugans regiment, this last service being about the time of the surrender of Cornwallis.

William moved to Ky. in 1800, lived there 9 years, then moved to Washington Co. Ind. He applied for a pension Sept. 26, 1832, and it began with March 4, 1831, amounting to \$30. per annum. The information in this paragraph came from letters from the Veterans Adm., and from the Gen. Ace. office both in Washington, D. C., the first letter states that his brother Amos was living in Washington Co., Ind. in 1832. William's granddaughter Phoebe Wright Hill of Medora, Ind. has the silver buckles he wore in the Revolution, Patra Goss says he furnished every thing he used in the war, arms, money, and horses.

Prof. Smith says that Evans removed with his brother Amos Wright to Powell's Valley, Va., then later between 1800 and 1806, to Wayne Co., Ky., then to Howard Co., Mo., in the fall of 1829. Cumberland Co., Ky. census for 1810 gives an Evans Wright over 45, one male under 10, one 10-16, two 16-26, five females and one slave.

2-8 Philburt Wright was born in Rowan Co., N. C. on March 29, 1768, the youngest son of Richard Wright Sr. and his wife, Ann. He was m. Aug. 16, 1793, in Rowan Co., N. C., to Mary (Molly) Sears. She was b. Feb. 13, 1776. She was the daughter of Christian Sears, and his wife Katharine (or Catherine). Christian Sears and his family moved to Kentucky in the early 1800's and he died in Pee Wee Valley in 1843.

Philburt Wright moved with his family to Rowan Co., N. C., to Clark's Grant, Ind. territory in 1808. He made one crop here and in 1809, he moved to what was then Harrison Co., and what is now Washington Twp., Washington Co., Ind. He entered govt. land and settled on a farm three miles south of Salem where he and his wife spent the remainder of their days.

During the war of 1812 when the Indians were hostile, he built a block house on the branch near his home, where the families of the neighborhood could go for protection in the event of an Indian Raid.

They were the parents of twelve children and he was very successful in business as he gave each of his children a farm. They were members of the Church of Christ at Blue River.

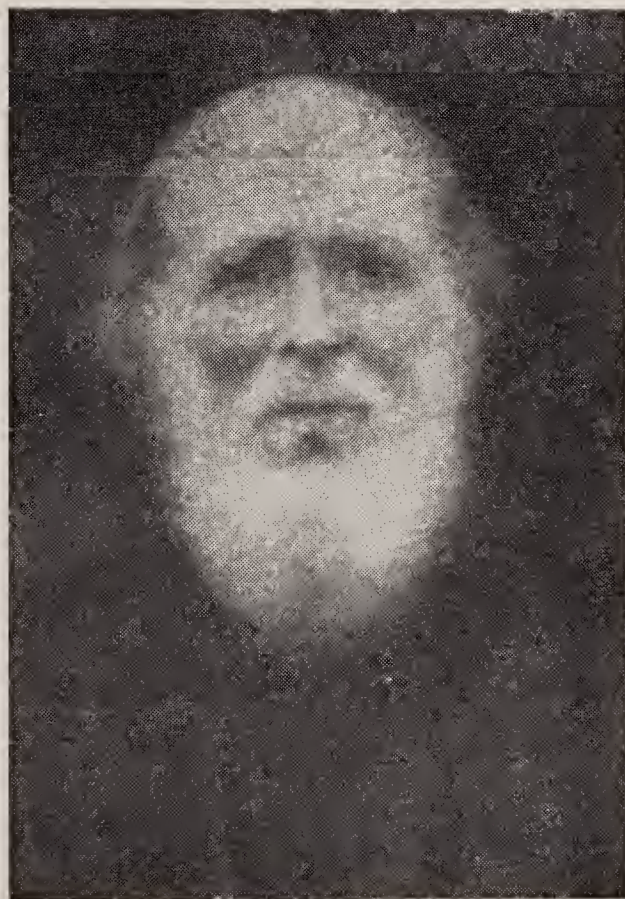

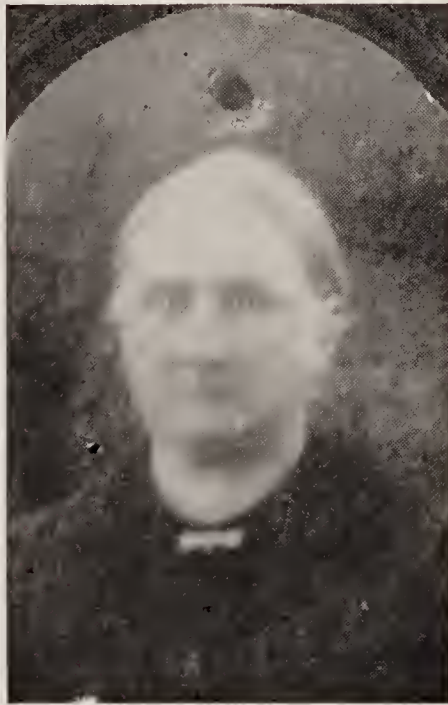

4-5 Philbird Marion Wright, son of Eli and Elizabeth (Bower) Wright, was b. two miles south of Salem, Indiana. In his early life he worked on a farm and assisted in the operation of a grist mill, his father having built one of the first mills in the twp. He attended school during the winter months. The schoolhouse was situated about two miles south of Salem near State Highway 35. It was built of logs, had a large fireplace and split logs for seats. Later he attended school at the old Seminary at Salem, where Professor John I. Morrison was teaching. He also attended what was probably known as Indianapolis Business University and graduated from there in 1853. Indianapolis was a small place at that time, the business section being built along the Old National Road. He lived at the home of his brother Adam H. Wright for a while and in about 1855 the house burned with all

his books and family records. He taught school for a while and then engaged in agricultural pursuits; in 1865 he went in partnership with his brother Adam H. and Emanuel Zink. They operated a saw mill for two years.

On May 28, 1863, he was m. to Barbara Elizabeth Wiseman, b. in Pierce twp., Washington Co., Ind., Aug. 31, 1831. She was a daughter of Jacob and Mary (Magdalene (Ratts) Wiseman, who immigrated from Davidson Co., N. C. to Pierce

twp., Washington Co., Ind in 1823. She also taught school in her early life. (For Wiseman history see book pub. by Grant F. Wright). They settled on a farm about three miles south of Salem and spent the remainder of their lives there. At the time of his death, he had lived on a farm for more than sixty years. Barbara Elizabeth Wiseman d. Feb. 21, 1905. Both buried in Crown Hill Cemetery, Salem.

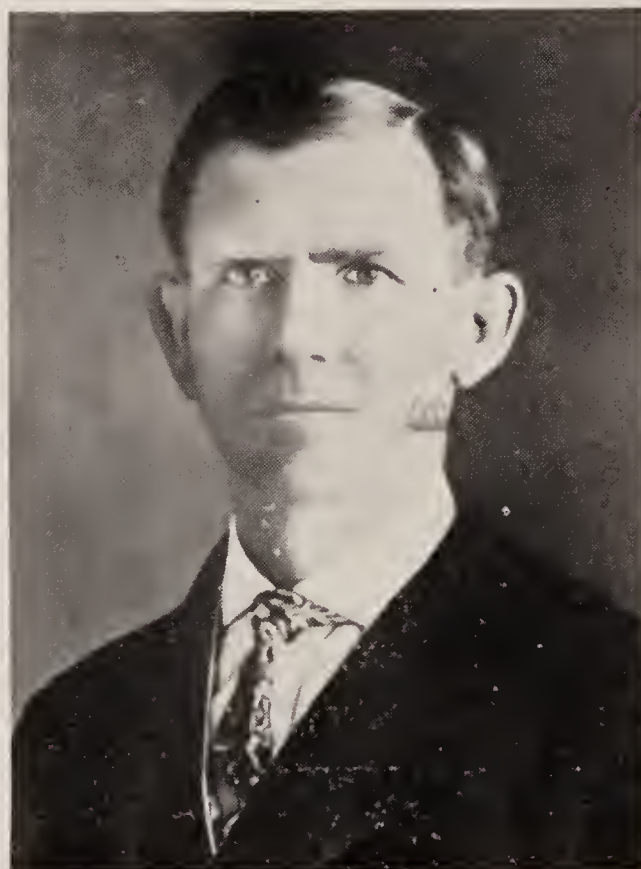

She had contributed to many newspapers and magazines and her death interrupted what promised to be a notable career as a writer. She was buried in the Crown Hill Cemetery, Salem, Ind.

THE WRIGHTS

By Prof. W. Wayne Smith, Moscow, Idaho, who has had many years of experience in genealogical research in different parts of the United States. There are many theories about who Richard Wright's father, b. 1730, was.

1—Capt. Richard Wright, said to be the immigrant ancestor, born in England, 1633, to Virginia before 1656. Patented 2200 acres of land on the Potomac River in Va., in 1658; this tract included the land that subsequently became Mt. Vernon the Home of George Washington. Capt. Wright settled on this land in 1661. His will proven in Northumberland Co., Va. Dec. 10, 1663. He married in 1655, Ann Mottrom, (dau. of Col. John Mottrom and Mary Spencer of Northumberland Co., Va.) born died , children Francis, Mottrom and Ann.

(1)—Francis Wright born 1659 died 1713, see further.

(2)—Mottrom Wright, settled at Condon on Elk Run, Md., married Ruth Grigg, (dau. of Robert Grigg the widow of his uncle John Mottrom, against the protest of the Church, they were separated after living together for ten years) he died in the Parish of St. Dunstone, London, Eng. in 1770. Children, Franes (m. Dr. Joseph Beifield, (son of Beifield of Nansemond Co., Va.) born Jan. 7, 1685 d. 1707, son Thomas Wright Beifielf,) and Mottrom Wright Jr. (m. Ruth and died without issue.

Served in Rev. War, received grant of land for the service, married in Fauquier Co., Va., 1753 Ann Williams, (dau. of Jonas Williams and Honor his wife) born 1735, died 1825. Children, William, Elizabeth, Nancy, Agathy and prob. Gideon.

(William Wright, b. 1779, d. 1825, m. 1802 Sallie Mitchell, b. 1784, d. 1825, issue).

A theory of Richard Wright, b. 1730. Thomas Wright, b. 1610, and wife—Cransbrake came to the U. S. A. about 1638, to Plymouth Colony with their five children, Thomas, James, b. 1632, d. 1705, Lydia, Samuel, Josepy, Wright. Here are four brothers. After the death of his wife he moved to the settlement at Wethersfield in April, 1670. His will is on record at Hartford, Conn. m. Mary Weed, children, James, Thomas, Jonas, Daniel, Hannah and Lydia, Daniel Wright, b.

Glastonbury, Conn. in 1674, m. Eleanor Benton dau. of Edward and Mary Benton. Moved first to Virginia then to North Carolina. The records show that Daniel Wright bought land in what is now known as Surry Co., at that time was included in the boundaries of Rowan Co., N. C. Children, Gideon, Richard, John, Benjamin, William, Samuel, James and Isaac. Richard Wright came to Rowan Co., N. C. and settled in that part of the state now known as Montgomery Co. He entered many acres of land and was a successful farmer. His will is in Chapter one. John Wright became a minister and moved to Virginia. I have not found Daniel father of Richard in N. C., records. Have had a very careful search made and as there is no record I am strongly inclined to think that Daniel (supposed to have died 1767), went to Va., with some of his sons—as there is no record of him in Va., my idea is that he will appear one of these days in West Virginia records. I came across the following which makes me think that I may be correct: Washington Co., Va. Nov. 24 1798, Wm. Huston to Eben Wright 415 acres in Lee Co. Botetourt Co. 1773. The names of James Wright, Peter Wright, appear and in Montgomery Co., Va. 1780, are to be found Richard Wright, Hezekiah Wright.

The Morgan Family

Most of the older Wright relatives who have Morgan blood, say that we are related to Gen. Daniel Morgan, but we have been unable to prove this. *West Va. Historical Mag.*, issue for Oct. 1904, pps. 273-8 gives an article on Gen. Daniel Morgan, by Delia Agnes McCullough. This article says that John Morgan was the first immigrant; does not say how related to James. It gives James Morgan (father of Gen. Daniel Morgan) and his brothers and sisters as follows:

1. James Morgan, d. 1782, m. Elenora , and Sarah Himmeline.
2. Isaac Morgan, founder of Morgantown, Bucks Co., Pa.
3. John Morgan, went to Redstone in 1750, then to Berkeley Co., Va.
4. Sarah Morgan, m. Squire Boone, moved to Zadkin, N. C., then to Ky. (the parents of Daniel Boone.) One account in Davidson Co., N. C. history says Sarah's father was Edward Morgan, and that she married in 1720.

James Morgan and Elenora had two children: Olivia m. John McCulloch, and Daniel Morgan, b. 1736, d. 1802. Daniel left home at 16 after a misunderstanding with his father and went down by Lancaster into Va., to the home of his uncle, John Morgan in Berkeley Co. Gen. Daniel Morgan married Abigail Bailey after the Rev. War and had two daughters, Nancy who m. Gen. Tresley Neville, and Betsey, who m. Major Heard of Ky.

Sarah Himmeline Morgan kept a house of entertainment on Philadelphia and Eastern road after her husband's death. With her, was the widow of Mordecai Morgan and Dr. Abel Morgan of Philadelphia. These must have been relatives of James Morgan.

R. H. Hutchison of Graham, N. C., is a descendant of Perminter Morgan, b. in Va. in 1755. He was in Guilford Co., N. C. on Deep river in 1773; was a noted Baptist preacher; had a brother, Club Footed Jim, called Bush Whacker Jim in the Rev. War period. Alford Wright says our James Morgan (father of Elijah who had a son Perminter) was a sniper in the Rev. War. However we cannot find proof that it was the same man, and Mr. Hutchison cannot connect our line.

Biographical Record of Bartholomew and Jackson counties, Ind. pub. 1904 by B. F. Bowen, page 745 says Martha Morgan (wife of William Wright) was the dau. of James and Mary Morgan. Levi Woodrum, descendant of Richard Wright Jr. said that three Morgan girls married three Wright brothers, hence the family may have been in part like this:

1790 census of Rowan Co., N. C. gives James, James Jr. and John Morgan on the same page (177) as some of our Wrights. *Ind. Mag. of History* for Dec. 1926, says Mary Morgan, dau. of James Morgan whose mother was Molly Davis, m. Arthur Parr. She had a brother James, who was a school teacher in N. C. The Parrs know nothing further about the older Morgans.

Elijah Morgan and descendants

He was uncle of James Wright; Barbara Morgan, Elijah's sister, being James Wright's mother; she married Benjamin Wright. Elijah Morgan married Mary Crum, b. 1775, d. Oct. 28, 1862. They came to Monroe Co., Ind. 1817 and entered land in Monroe Co., Ind. Clear Creek Twp. 1817. It joined the farms of James Wright who came to Monroe Co., Ind. in 1816. Elijah Morgan was a member of Lodge 173 A. F. and A. M. This is on his tombstone. Children:

Sears, two negroes, Henry aged fourteen years and Betsy aged eleven years, to have and to hold the same during her natural life, after her decease the same to be free provided however the same negroes Henry and Betsy, if all have arrived at the age of twenty-one years, should they be under that age it is my will that they be hired out by my executors until they shall have arrived at the age, Also I will and bequeath unto my beloved wife one negro girl named Cleo, aged eleven years to have and hold the same forever. Also one horse and one side saddle. one silver watch, one bed and furniture one Bureau, and one dressing table. and also the one third part of the money derived out of the disposition of my estate hereafter to be named:

Also I will and ordain, that the executors of this my last will and testament shall with all convenient speed after my decease proceed to sell to the highest bidder on credit of one year and two years, the farm with all the appurtenances, on which I now live, consisting of one hundred acres fee simple, for the doing and executing whereof I do by these presents give to my said executors full power and authority to bargain and sell and convey the same to any person or persons, their heirs or assigns forever in fee simple.

Also, it is my will that Riley, Jerry and Thomas, male slaves that may be born after this date in my family, be hired out until each of them shall have earned four hundred dollars, also that slaves Sallie and Margaret and female slaves that may be born in my family after this date, be hired out until they shall each of them have earned two hundred dollars. After the above named slaves shall have earned by their hire, the above mentioned sums, my executors are authorized to set them free. Also that Lucy be free at the age of twenty-one years. It is also my will that Lewis, Betsy and Mary be free at my decease.

All the rest and residue of my personal estate not herein disposed of to be sold to the highest bidder, on credit of twelve months. The several sums arising from the sale of my land, the hire of my negroes, and sale of my personal estate (debts due and cash on hand, after paying my just debts) be divided equally among my six children or their heirs or assigns, after deducting from each of the several sums that each of them have received from my estate and applied to their own use and benefit the sums annexed to each of their names are the sums received by each, viz:;

To Polly Wright, one hundred and thirty-one dollars; Sarah Shires, one hundred and fifty-five; Betsy Wright, one hundred dollars; Jacob Sears, two hundred and sixty dollars; David Sears, two hundred ten dollars, and John Sears two hundred dollars.

And I do hereby appoint my friend, Jonathan Hardin of Oldham County, Kentucky, and Philbert Wright, my son-in-law of the State of Indiana, my executors of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal, the 22d. of June, in the year of our Lord, 1840.

The above instrument of one sheet was now here subscribed by Christian Sears, the Testator in the presence of each of us, and was at the same time declared to be his last will and testament and we as attesting witnesses sign our names hereto.

The Sears Family

By Grant Wright, Salem, Ind., and Prof. W. Wayne Smith, University of
Idaho, Moscow, Idaho

The Sears Family of Rowan, Co., N. C., Nicholas, Co., Ky., Indiana and Missouri, is descended from Johannes Zaher, from the German Canton of Switzerland. He was a Religious Refugee, belonging to the Dunkard Church, seeking Religious Liberty in the new World. He settled with his family in Lancaster Co., Pa., about 1740, lived at Ephrata for a while and removed thru Maryland to the Yadkin Valley in North Carolina where he died.

1—Johannes Zaher, (pronounced t a i r, and meaning *tough* in the German language, but was generally called Sears in the English), born in Switzerland about 1710, came to Pennsylvania about 1740 with his family, and died in the Yadkin Valley, N. C. leaving at least two sons, Christian and John, probably others.

Christian and John Sears are the only families whose names are mentioned in the Salisbury District in Rowan Co., N. C. There is only one Christian Sears mentioned in the 1790 census of N. C., and Penn. There are four John Sears and a number of others mentioned in different counties of N. C. and Penn.

The 1790 Census for N. C. shows Christian Sears the head of a family, has eleven children, seven girls and four boys. Allowing two years for each child we have twenty two years and subtract 22 yrs from 1790 and we have 1768 the probable date of his marriage. He would have been 26 yrs. old when married.

The above data, right or wrong, is submitted from my research relating to the genealogy of Christian Sears and I am quite sure he was not a myth as my father had seen him and I received a letter from the people who own his old farm and she stated it was called the Christian Sears farm.

(A)—Christian Sears, born in N. C. about 1742, married Catherine , mentions his wife Hannah R. Dawkins Sears, daughter of William Dawkins of Oldham Co., Ky. They were married on Sept. 19, 1834. He bought land in N. C. on January 15, 1794 and Sept. 2, 1797 and sold it April 30, 1805. His will was probated in Oldham Co., Ky. on Aug. 21, 1843, Children, Polly (Wright), Sarah (Shires), Betsy (Wright), Jacob, David and John Sears. Executors, Johathan Hardin and Philbert Wright (son-in-law).

Christian Sears moved from Rowan Co., North Carolina to Beargrass, near Louisville, Ky. in 1802. Later he moved near Pee Wee Valley, Ky. He lived to be 101 years old. When at the age of 100 he with his young wife visited relatives in Washington Co., Indiana and died soon after he returned home. Grant Wright says he thinks Christian was nearly 100 when he married his last wife. His first wife was Catherine, and his second, Hannah R. Dawkins, m. in Ky. 9-19 1834.

Philburt Wright married Mary Sears in 1793 in Rowan Co., N. C. He was 25 and she was 17. Prof. Smith states Christian Sears married Hannah Dawkins in Oldham Co., Ky. in 1834. This seems about right as I have heard my father say he was in his 90's and she in her 40's. My father had seen them when they visited at his mother's home. My father was 10 yrs. old at that time. I remember hearing him tell of an incident that happened while they were at his mothers. They had only one pipe and both smoked this pipe; while strolling through the orchard they lost this pipe and it seemed one blamed the other; quite an argument followed, it made such an impression on my father he being a young boy he never forgot it. I wrote to Oldham Co., Ky. and obtained a copy of his will and inventory and there was where I learned the year of his death and his age and the date his will was probated. As I remember, my father said he was 100 when he visited at his mothers and died soon after he returned home.

Elizabeth Betsy Sears married James Wright, son of Benjamin and Barbara Morgan Wright. Their record is in James Wright record.

2—John Sears, (son of Johannes Zaher the immigrant), born in N. C. about 1749, is said by some of his grandchildren to have served in the Rev. War, removed about 1802, to Nicholas Co., Ky., where he died on March 12, 1839. He married in Rowan Co., N. C. about 1778, Catherine Conrad, born in N. C. 1760, and died in Nicholas Co., Ky., in 1822. Their Children: Catherine, John, Matthia, Elizabeth, George, David, Michael, Alexander, Henry, Susan, and Molly. John Sears married again in Nicholas Co., Ky. , Children: William, Solomon, Jacob and Adam.

Hon. David S. Huffstutter

Biography copied from Goodspeed's History of Lawrence, Orange and Washington Counties

Hon. David S. Huffstutter who has played a conspicuous and honorable part in the affairs of Orange County, is a son of George and Catherine (Sears) Huffstutter, the former of whom was a native of Maryland, born January 12, 1779. George Huffstutter passed his early boyhood in Washington, Penn., and while yet a youth moved to Bourbon County, Ky., where he married. His wife was a native of North Carolina, and was born January 1779. In the year 1816 he immigrated to Harrison County, Ind., where he engaged in farming. His death occurred in that County in 1861, preceded by his wife's in 1852, in Floyd County.

David S. was born in Bourbon County, Ky., Sept. 21, 1808. His settlement in Orange County was in the year 1835, on the same farm where he now resides, one mile north of Orleans. He soon became known for his more than ordinary ability

and integrity, which resulted in his election to the State Legislature in 1846. From that time, with the exception of one term he acted as legislator for his county until 1855, serving in both the House of Representatives and Senate.

At the end of that time against the solicitations of his friends, and disregarding the call of his party, he declined any further political honors. As a public servant he was distinguished for a faithful and conscientious discharge of his official duty, and unswerving though honest fealty to his party, and he is now as he always has been, an ardent and staunch democrat. On the 24th of May 1832 he led to Hymen's altar Miss Polly A. Bower, who was born in Clark County, Ind., May 5, 1811. Her parents were Solomon and Jennie (Parr) Bower who came to Indiana in 1806, from North Carolina. To Mr. and Mrs. Huffstutter four children were born, only one of which Andrew J. is now living. Her death occurred April 20, 1879.

Mr. Huffstutter is now spending the remainder of his days upon his splendid farm of 1000 acres which he has earned by his own industry and energy.

David's mother was a Sears and it seems she was a daughter of John Sears who was the son of Johannes Zaher and brother of our Christian Sears. I believe I have heard my father say she was not a sister of his grand mother Mary Sears.

One incidencce Prof. relates that Our Christian Sears the son of Johannes Zaher herded on the Swiss Alps, in and above the clouds when they were so wet that he—Christian Sears washed his hands with the water from the clouds.

I will have to admit that there is some confusion and probably error in our genealogical data of Christian Sears; however, it is accurate enough to make good biography if it is properly arranged, and that is as much as we may expect.

The Kutch Family

1 Tilford Kutch was born about 1750, exact date not known. He was in the Revolutionary War.

A Prussian trans-ocean shipping company provided passage for a number of women from Prussia in the early 1780's and hoped to collect the price for passage from the prospective bridegrooms waiting in Virginia. Tilford Kutch and his soldier friend, Adolph Cane, each met and married one of these imported girls. Pheobe King married Adolph Cane in 1784. Tilford Kutch married Anna Prussia the same year. The two couples lived near each other and began to labor for individual existence, their main living was wild game, nuts, fruit in the forest, with fish.

On Nov. 3, 1786, a son was born to Tilford and Anna Kutch in Virginia. 2-1 John Kutch, son of Tilford and Anna Kutch, was quite small when his parents both died, probably by a fever. Typhoid fever was common in the country at

that time. Adolph Cane assumed the responsibility of caring for the orphan child, John Kutch. In the late 1790's, Adolph Cane and wife Phoebe, together with their three children, and young John Kutch, moved to N. W. North Carolina. It was here that John Kutch and Elizabeth Cane were married in 1804. Elizabeth was the oldest child of Adolph and Phoebe Cane. Here they had three children:

Stories then went by mouth, as there were no mail, newspapers, telephones, telegraph or radios. They were told that Indiana Territory of the North West was opened for settlement. They decided at once to go to Indiana and began preparing for the journey. Their method of travel consisted of a home-made two wheeled cart drawn by a young milk cow and a three year old bull. They packed their clothing, a few household necessities, tools such as ax, plow, augur, hoe and drawing knife and a variety of seeds. They also took a supply of food, dried pumpkin, jug of sorghum, salt, bacon, corn meal, and a gun to kill game. In the summer of 1811, they traveled thru unbroken forest, over Indian trails some 500 miles. They were three months on the road. They came over the Appalachian mountains, thru the pass by the "Lone Pine." The Ohio river was crossed at Louisville. They decided to tarry awhile in Washington Co., near Salem, Indiana, which was a small settlement. They remained there nearly four years and here two more children were born:

The Sanders Family

1-1 Joseph and Mary Sanders lived in Parquamans Co., N.C., when their son Henry was born, Oct. 6, 1751. March 21, 1761, Joseph bought of Abrom Wilson a negro woman 17 or 18 years old, name Judith, for the sum of 60 lbs., lawful about \$300, proclamation money of the Province aforesaid, signed, sealed and delivered in the presents of Robert Newby and John Sanders. This John Sanders is a brother to Henry, b. 1751, of the Rev. War.

2-1 Henry Sanders was born Oct. 26, 1751 and died Feb. 13, 1834. He was the son of Joseph and Mary Sanders. Henry Sanders married Dicy Blake, daughter of John and Morning Blake, on Oct. 18, 1779. Dicy Blake Sanders was born in the year of 1761 and died July 5, 1841.

He was a Baptist minister for forty years. The Sanders were people of sturdy, devout, religious faith, and the pioneering spirit that created new frontiers when America was reaching out to discover itself. According to family tradition, Joseph and Mary, branch of the Sanders family, came from England and apparently first settled in South Carolina. Henry was captured by the British at the Battle of Rocky Mount, near his home, as he was gathering acorns to feed General Green's starving army. After being confined for some time he escaped and continued fighting in the Revolutionary cause until the war ended.

Lillie Wright Lane White the writer of this book is a great great grandchild of Henry Sanders born in Perquimane County, North Carolina, Oct. 26, 1751. At ten years of age he moved with his father to North Hampton County. In a short time to Ronanoke River. When about twenty years of age he moved to Fairfield County in South Carolina, where he resided until he entered the service as a volunteer in

the South Carolina State Militia in the spring of 1775. He was among the first to volunteer and enter service. With the exception of short intervals of a few weeks each, he was in service until about the time of the Battle of Yorktown, Virginia. He had several enlistments, served part of the time under Captains Lewis and Baykins and General Green. During his third tour of service he was in the Battle of Rocky Mount where he was taken prisoner by the British. After being confined several days he made his escape. Ten years after the war he moved to Anson County, North Carolina and resided there about three years, then he moved to Cheshire where he remained one year, then moved to Grange County, East Tennessee, then to Knox County Kentucky, then to Indiana. He lived in Orange County, Bartholomew County and Monroe County where he lived at the time of application for pension in 1832. He drew a pension for two years. He is buried in the old Mayfield cemetery near Bloomington, Ind., Monroe County, (From records in the Pension Department in Washington, D.C.).

cutting a birthday cake made for him by his daughter, Mrs. Ben M. Allison, the former Miss Pansy Sanders.

The Rotary Club, of which he is the oldest member, and the Useless Citizens club sent him flowers. On the card accompanying the Useless Citizens' gorgeous spray of gladioli, roses, asters and painted daisies was this message: 'To Kid Sanders from the Useless Bunch who love him so much and wish him many more happy birthdays, and remember that 88 is not bad even for a republican.' Rotary sent a spray of gladioli. Senator Sanders said—'it is a great pleasure to be remembered so graciously by my friends, and I thank them all.'

At 88 the man who built up two successful plow manufacturing businesses in Chattanooga and for years was a first power in Tennessee republican politics is still calm, patient and certain, still amused at witty and pleasant things and quick to smile".
